RESPONSE IN OPPOSITION TO MOTION FOR STAY OF EXECUTION

Six days prior to his execution, which, by order of the Tennessee Supreme Court dated January 15, 2002, is scheduled for April 10, 2002, Abdur'Rahman asks this Court for a stay to allow consideration of six claims presented in a contemporaneously-filed motion to reopen post-conviction. None of the claims meets the criteria to reopen under Tenn. Code Ann. §40-30-217(a) and, indeed, as Abdur'Rahman admits in his motion to reopen, he has previously litigated claims of constitutional error challenging his conviction and death sentence on direct appeal, in post-conviction proceedings, and in federal habeas proceedings.

Tenn. Code Ann. §40-30-220(b) provides:

Where a petitioner is under a sentence of death and the petition is not the first petition under this part attacking that judgment, or a motion to reopen has been filed, no court shall stay the execution unless a court of competent jurisdiction first finds that a motion to reopen which meets the requirements set out in §40-30-217 has been granted.

In other words, this court is without authority to grant a stay unless it first determines that the criteria to reopen under §40-30-217(a) have been satisfied. For the reasons set forth in the State's response in opposition to the motion to reopen post-convcition petition, no such showing can be made here. Accordingly, Abdur'Rahman's motion for a stay of execution should be denied.
