TESTING LOCATION:
Tennessee Supreme Court Building
401 7th Avenue North
Nashville, TN 37219

The Supreme Court Building is at the corner of Charlotte and 7th Avenue in downtown Nashville. To reach the Supreme Court Building from I-40, take either the downtown Charlotte Avenue or Church Street exit and drive toward downtown Nashville.

To go directly from the Interstates to the Supreme Court Building:

FROM THE CHARLOTTE AVENUE I-40 EXIT: Drive down Charlotte Avenue toward downtown until you come to 7th Avenue. The Supreme Court building is on the corner of 7th Avenue and Charlotte.

FROM THE CHURCH STREET I-40 EXIT: Drive down Church Street toward downtown until you come to 5th Avenue. Turn left on 5th Avenue and go straight until Charlotte. Turn left onto Charlotte and the Supreme Court building is on the corner of 7th Avenue and Charlotte.

To get to the Nashville City Center Parking Garage:

Parking may be available in the Nashville City Center Parking Garage. In the event that parking is not available in the Nashville City Center Parking Garage, you will need to seek alternate parking. The Nashville Public Library and McKendree United Methodist Parking Garages are located on 6th Street, approximately two blocks from the Supreme Court Building. A number of Central Parking lots are also located throughout downtown.

THE AOC DOES NOT VALIDATE PARKING. PARKING EXPENSES ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CANDIDATE.

FROM THE CHARLOTTE AVENUE I-40 Exit: Drive down Charlotte Avenue toward downtown until you come to 4th Avenue. Turn right on 4th Avenue, go 2 blocks and then turn right on Union Street. The garage entrance for the Nashville City Center is on Union Street on the left between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue. Pull into the garage and park. Take the elevator to the lobby. Take the elevator to the lobby. Come out of the building and proceed up 6th street to Charlotte Avenue. Turn left onto Charlotte Avenue and the Supreme Court Building will be on your right at the corner of 7th and Charlotte.

FROM THE CHURCH STREET I-40 EXIT: Drive down Church Street toward downtown until you come to 5th Avenue. Turn left on 5th Avenue, go 1 block and then turn left onto Union Street. The garage entrance for the Nashville City Center is on Union Street on the left between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue. Pull into the garage and park. Take the elevator to the lobby. Come out of the building and proceed up 6th street to Charlotte Avenue. Turn left onto Charlotte Avenue and the Supreme Court Building will be on your right at the corner of 7th and Charlotte.

THE COURT INTERPRETER WRITTEN EXAM

Registration and Exam: Registration starts promptly at 12:45 pm (Everyone must be present at or before 12:45 pm.) The exam will begin promptly at 1:00 pm. You will have two hours and fifteen minutes to complete the exam.

What YOU MUST BRING to the testing session:

- Letter of admission
- Positive photo identification – This must be either a United States government-issued driver's license or passport. If you do not possess either of these, contact Ryan Mouser at (615) 741-2687 PRIOR TO THE REGISTRATION DEADLINE.
- Two (2) pencils

You will not have access to any of your personal belongings during the exam. If you will be in need of medication during the exam, please make arrangements with the proctor ahead of time or make a note on your application form.

Please note that your examination scores, as well as all other information in the Court Interpreter Credentialing Program's records, are considered public records under state law and are subject to disclosure upon the request of a member of the public.
