Court Interpreter Intensive Skills Building Workshop for Spanish Oral Exams

The AOC has received a one-time grant award from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) through the Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant Program. This funding allows for the payment of the costs of currently registered interpreters to take an intensive skills building course to help them prepare for the Tennessee Court Interpreter Program oral examinations in Spanish.

Course Description

This 10-hour course will provide instruction on techniques to assist registered interpreters with improving sight translation, consecutive and simultaneous interpreting skills in preparation for the Tennessee Court Interpreter Program oral exams. Students will need to bring a recording device and a device to play back the recording such as a tape recorder, digital recorder, laptop, etc.

Schedule

Registration period: March 3, 2011 through March 25, 2011. A maximum of 10 persons per class – registration will be on a first come, first served basis.
Nashville course will be held April 2-3, 2011
Knoxville course will be held April 30 – May 1, 2011
