Please find enclosed the statistical report of the Board of Judicial Conduct covering filings and dispositions for the month of November, 2014, as mandated by Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-207(a).

Please also find enclosed the Quarterly Report for the first quarter of this fiscal year, as mandated by Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-207(b). Although it is not due until January 20, 2015, we have completed the tally and felt you should have it as soon as possible. Our First Quarterly Report for fiscal year 2014-2015 also includes something new pursuant to the new amendment to our reporting statutes: a list of members' names along with the total of votes cast on each complaint either voting to dismiss the complaint or voting for a formal investigation on the complaint (Tenn. Code Ann. §17-5-304(c)(3) – "The investigative panel shall review the disciplinary counsel's recommendations and either dismiss the complaint or authorize a full investigation."). Not every member voted an equal number of times, as there were a different number of complaints in each Grand Division of the state, and no member was assigned a complaint against a judge from that member's Grand Division. Also, some of the members had to recuse themselves as having practiced before that judge, as having

conflicts of interest, or as having too close a relationship with the judge or the complainant. As Justices Kirby and Bivins and Judge Tim Easter changed judicial positions and were removed from the Board as disqualified, their replacements not having yet been selected or sworn, only the 12 present members are listed in this quarter's vote total.
