SECOND AMENDMENT TO COVID-19 JUDICIAL DISTRICT PLAN 24TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT TENNESSEE EFFECTIVE MAY 20, 2021

The Tennessee Supreme Court has filed an order entered on May 14, 2021, which modifies its preceding orders regarding COVID-19. Pursuant to that order the Plan for the Conduct of In-Person Proceedings for Non-Emergency Matters In The 24th Judicial District Of Tennessee Regarding The COVID-19 Pandemic is amended as follows:

- Courtroom capacity limits are suspended subject to the discretion of the Judge presiding provided that three (3) feet of social distancing between persons in the courtroom is maintained.
- 2. Persons entering the courtroom are subject to health pre-screening and temperature checks in the discretion of the Judge presiding.
- 3. The Judge presiding may limit the admission of persons into the courtroom to those whose presence is required for the fair transaction of proceedings.
- 4. The Judge presiding may prohibit admission of persons into the courtroom when the person has had a known exposure to COVID-19 within the prior seven days.
- 5. The use of facial coverings by persons in the courtroom shall be in the discretion of the Judge presiding except no person shall be prohibited from wearing a protective face covering.

6. All prior orders not herein altered shall remain in effect
