ORDER REGARDING PARENTING SCHEDULES DURING SCHOOL CLOSURES

This order applies in every suit affecting the parent-child relationship filed in any court sitting in the 29th Judicial District where a parenting plan/visitation schedule has been entered. Hereinafter, "child" refers to a child or children who are the subject of a court order. **IT IS ORDERED THAT**:

For purposes of determining a person's right to visitation/physical custody of a child under a court-ordered parenting plan/visitation schedule, the original published 2019/2020 school schedule/calendar for the school system which the child attends shall control in all instances when the school's schedule/calendar is the determinative factor of when visitation/custody is to occur. Except for the mutual agreements of the parties, the following are the only exceptions to this rule:

- 1. If either parent's state, county or city is under a government-mandated lockdown and the child is with that parent at the time lockdown goes into effect, then exchanges will be suspended through the end of the lockdown.
- 2. If the child or anyone residing in the home of a parent is diagnosed with COVID-19 while the child is in the home, visitation shall be suspended for 14 days following the diagnosis upon presentation to the other parent of a doctor's note confirming the diagnosis.
- 3. If anyone residing in the home of the parent who is entitled to exercise visitation is diagnosed with COVID-19 before visitation is scheduled to begin, the visitation shall be suspended for 14 days following such diagnosis.

Unless extended or vacated in a subsequent order, this order expires on May 30, 2020.
