OPINION

The appellant, James C. Cobb, was convicted of assault, a Class A misdemeanor, by a jury of his peers. The trial court sentenced the appellant to confinement in the Decatur County Jail for eleven months and twenty-nine days. However, the trial court suspended all but thirty days of the appellant's sentence and granted him probation for the balance of the sentence.

In this Court, the appellant contends that the trial court should have suspended his entire sentence.

This Court has conducted a <u>de novo</u> review of the record pursuant to Tenn. Code §40-35-401(d). This Court finds that the record supports the sentence imposed by the trial court. Therefore, the judgment is affirmed pursuant to Rule 20, Tenn. Ct. Crim. App.
