

AMENDMENT TO COVID-19 JUDICIAL DISTRICT PLAN
29TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT
EFFECTIVE MAY 17, 2021

On May 1, 2020, the Tennessee Supreme Court approved guidelines for in-person court proceeding for the Twenty-Ninety Judicial District (hereinafter the Plan). By amendment entered on June 9, 2020, and effective on June 15, 2020, the Plan was amended. The Plan is amended as follows:

The amendment entered on June 9, 2020, and effective on June 15, 2020, is vacated.

Parts A. (1), B and C of Section II are vacated.

Parts B, C, and E. (1) of Section IV are vacated.

Section V is vacated.

Section VI is vacated.

Parts C. (1) and H of Section VII are vacated.

The Plan is modified by adding a Section VIII, which shall read in its entirety as follows:

“The distance between persons in courtrooms shall be no less than three feet. So long as the courts remain open and accessible, judges will have the discretion to limit the number of people in a courtroom when health and safety conditions or circumstances necessitate. The Plan shall apply to all courts in the 29th Judicial District.”

It is SO ORDERED.
