Prior to taking the bench, U.S. District Judge Pam Reeves was one of two mediators appointed in December 2012 by Chief Judge Tom Varlan to mediate the property damage issues for over 880 plaintiffs in 63 pending cases arising from the coal ash spill at the Kingston Fossil Plant. Judge Reeves will discuss the history of the plant, the massive coal ash spill that occurred in December 2008, the history of the subsequent litigation, and the strategy of the mediators as they worked with representatives for TVA and 10 law firms for over 18 months to resolve the property damage issues resulting in the voluntary dismissal of the cases.
