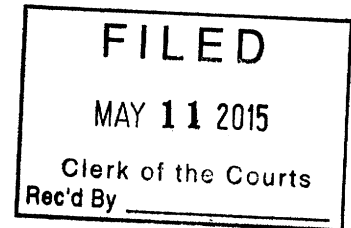

**ORDER**

Rule 27, Rules of the Tennessee Supreme Court, governed the Judicial Performance and Evaluation Program administered by the Judicial Performance Evaluation Commission (“Commission”). The Commission was created by section 17-4-201(b), Tennessee Code Annotated, and the Court adopted Rule 27 pursuant to section 17-4-201(a)(1). The Commission was terminated on June 30, 2013, and the Commission’s wind-up period expired on June 30, 2014. *See* Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 4-29-234(a)(37) and 4-29-112 (2011). Because the Commission has been terminated, the provisions of Rule 27 are obsolete, and the Court hereby repeals Rule 27 in its entirety (including the title of the rule). Rule 27 shall now be designated as “[Repealed]” in the published versions of the Rules of the Supreme Court. This amendment is effective upon the filing of this order.

The Clerk shall provide a copy of this order to LexisNexis and to Thomson Reuters. In addition, this order shall be posted on the Tennessee Supreme Court’s website.
