


What is Unclaimed Property

 Definition-Intangible personal property that has gone unclaimed by the rightful owner after a specified period.










Escheat



Sear Lé, Sear Lé, be it declared that any land that dost have no claimant, shall be given to the lord of the manor.

The old British common law practice where land with no owner was turned over to the lord or king of the manor.







21st Century

States are custodial in nature and not a true escheat.







Which state do I need to report to?

Priority rule was established and upheld by these three supreme court cases.

- <u>Texas v New Jersey</u>, US
 Supreme Court, 379 US
 674 (1965).
- <u>Pennsylvania v New</u>
 <u>York</u>, US Supreme
 Court, 407 US 206
 (1972).
- <u>Delaware v New York</u>, US Supreme Court, 507 US 490 (1993).

Priority Rule - Summary

- Concepts well established because of these three Supreme Court Cases.
- Holder is obligated to report to all states and is not confined to situations where the holder is authorized to do business or where they transact business in a state.



Incidental Property: 10 or fewer properties valued at \$1,000 or less



- Review your outstanding checks
- Checks that have been written off?
- Internal Payroll
- External Customer Refunds, Vendor Checks
- 3rd Party Agents








Activity

 Property is not presumed abandoned if the apparent owner indicates an interest in the property during the dormancy period.

Under TCA 66-29-113 provide specific examples of what constitutes activity or interest in the property.

Common question: What if I reissue the check?







Due Diligence

- For all property \$50 and greater
- No sooner than 180 days



- Must wait at least 60 days before reporting
- Must give owner 30 days to respond
- May send electronic mail, if no response must send first-class letter





Due Diligence

Must contains specific info: "Notice: The State of Tennessee requires us to notify you that your property may be transferred to the custody of the Treasurer if you don not contact us within thirty (30) days of this notice."

- 1. State that the property will be turned over to the Treasurer;
- 2. State that, after the property is turned over to the Treasurer, an apparent owner that seeks return of the property must file a claim with the Treasurer;
- 3. Identify any owners of the property;
- 4. Identify the nature and , except for property that does not have a fixed value, the value of the property that is subject of the notice;
- 5. State that the property which is not legal tender of the United States may be sold by the Treasurer; and
- 6. Provide instructions that the apparent owner must follow to prevent the holder from reporting and paying or delivering the property to the Treasurer.





Create your report

- Must be an approved NAUPA file
- Software: Free or \$\$\$
- Create your own file
- Contains list of property and who it belongs too

Compliance Disclosure Agreement

- Contract between holder and state
- Must not already be selected for audit
- Must provide scope and review technique
- 7 hard years vs 10 reporting years

- Internet
- Fairs and Festivals



- Letters to last known address
- Match with other databases
- Advertising
- Social Media






LOCAL GOVERNMENT REFUND

Are you aware that there is a provision to allow the Unclaimed Property Division to return what was reported back to the local government?

- County must file a resolution by June 1st requesting the funds back
- Must wait 18 months before we can return the funds
- Any property not returned to the owner may be returned to the local government minus an admin fee.
- The local government must still pay the owner if they come forward the full amount.
