<p>mediation process. The second session, from 10:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m., will consist of a two-hour discussion of Ethics in Mediation led by Prof. Carl Pierce, University of Tennessee W. Allen Separk Distinguished Professor of Law and Director of the Howard Baker, Jr. Center for Public Policy. Jean Munroe, Jackie Kittrell, and Becky Jacobs, University of Tennessee Associate Professor of Law, will also participate in the ethics presentation. The afternoon session, will be a 3-hour workshop, held from 1:15-4:30 p.m. (with a 15-minute break at 2:45). This will be a Reflective Mediation Practice Workshop led by John M. Peters, Ed.D., North Carolina State University, Professor in the Department of Educational Psychology and Counseling and Director of the Tennessee Teaching and Learning Center Institute for Reflective Practice. John Selser will assist Dr. Peters in the Reflective Practice Workshop. The workshop will identify seven skill areas that are critical to maximizing a mediator's ability to think critically and effectively at every step of the mediation process and will provide hands-on skill development in the most critical of those skill areas.</p>
