Valerie Radu, PhD, LCSW is the Director of the City of Chattanooga Family Justice Center and teaches social work law and ethics in the private sector. Dr. Radu has 20 years of experience as a practitioner, community leader and advocate as well as a faculty member and academic administrator in higher education settings. She is the founding member of the Grove Street Settlement House in Chattanooga and invited member of the SE TN Elder Abuse Coalition and the Hamilton Co Adult Protective Services Multidisciplinary Team. Since 1996 she has been a frequent presenter on aging issues, diversity/cultural competence, and leadership development in the southeastern United States for a variety of professional organizations and groups.
